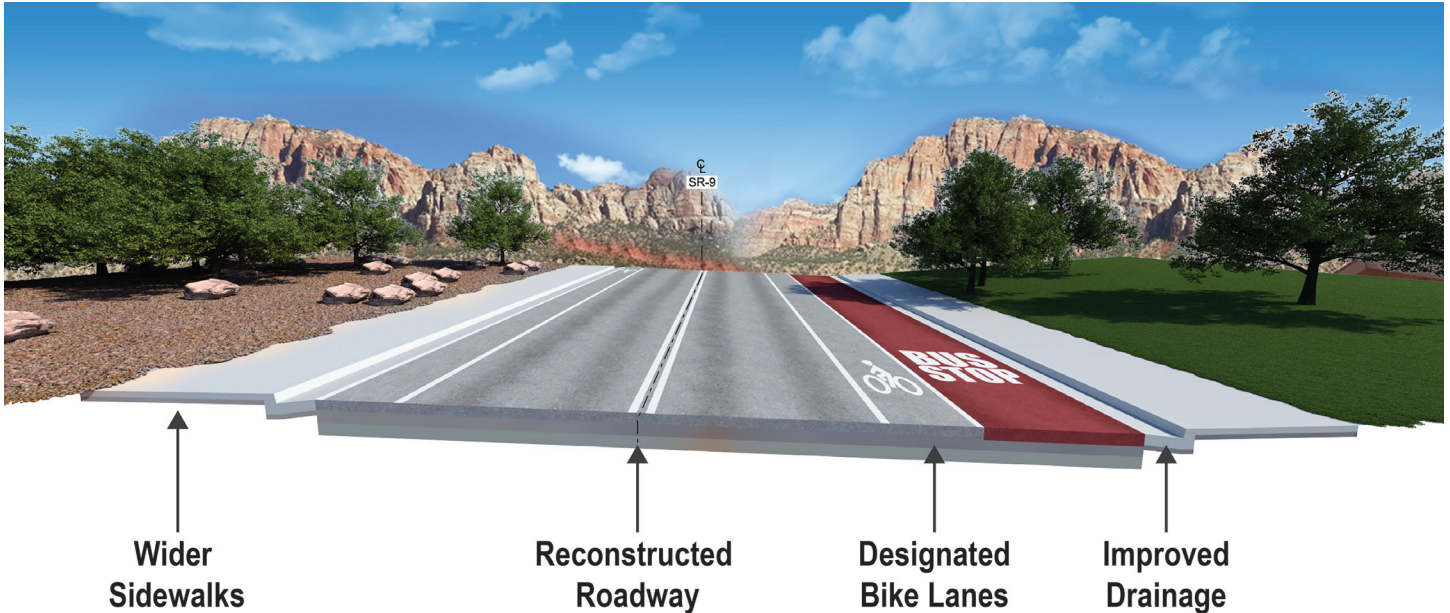


SR-9, FROM SPRINGDALE TO THE ZION NATIONAL PARK

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is fully reconstructing State Route 9 (Zion Park Boulevard) from Springdale to the Zion National Park gate. UDOT will also add wider sidewalks and designated bicycle lanes on both sides of the roadway throughout most of the town (with shared shoulders in the remaining areas) to heighten your experience with more pedestrian-friendly features. Our primary goal is to construct this project during the lowest visitation time-frame of October 2017 to April 2018.



What To Expect

We understand the importance of SR-9 to the community and how vital it is to keep traffic moving and access open. All businesses are open during construction and Zion National Park will remain completely accessible. While we will minimize impacts whenever possible, we also want you to be prepared for what to expect while visiting Springdale:

- » Construction is ongoing through April 15, 2017. In order to complete the project in this short time-frame, work will occur 24 hours a day, 6 days per week. Expect an increase in noise, dust and vibration during the day and at night.
- » SR-9 is reduced to one-way traffic with flaggers and a temporary traffic signal at two locations throughout the project corridor. Expect delays of up to 25 minutes during non-holiday times and over an hour during the President's Day weekend in February and Spring Break weeks in March.
- » In February, roadway reconstruction and paving will be ongoing in the travel lanes heading towards the park between the Desert Pearl Inn and the Park Gate, and in the travel lanes heading away from the park near The Majestic View Lodge.
