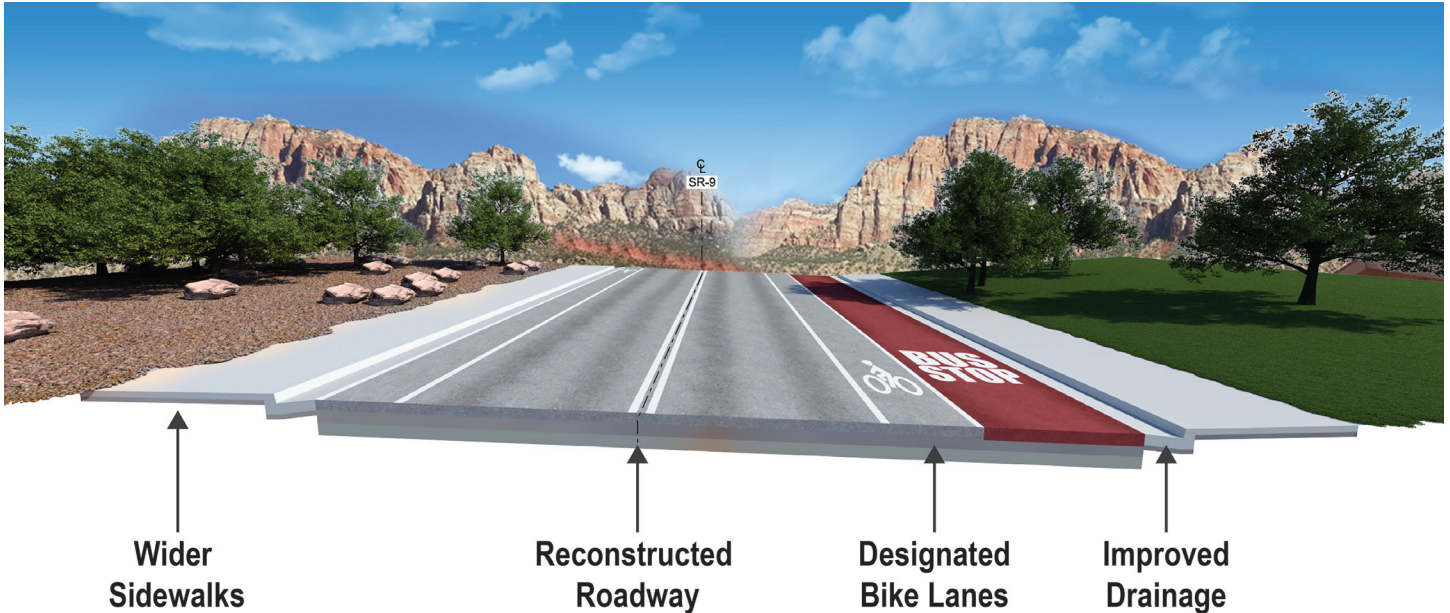


SR-9, FROM SPRINGDALE TO THE ZION NATIONAL PARK

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is fully reconstructing State Route 9 (Zion Park Boulevard) from Springdale to the Zion National Park gate. UDOT also add wider sidewalks and designated bicycle lanes on both sides of the roadway throughout most of the town to heighten visitors' experience with more pedestrian-friendly features. Our primary goal is to construct this project during the lowest DUN visitation time-frame April 2018.



What To Expect

All businesses are open during construction. While we will minimize impacts whenever possible, we also want you to be prepared for what to expect while visiting Springdale:



- » Construction is ongoing through mid-April 2018. In order to complete the project in just 7 months, work will occur 24 hours a day, 6 days per week. Expect an increase in noise, dust and vibration during the day and at night. No work is planned for Saturday night, February 17 and Sunday day, February 18.
- » SR-9 ZOO reduced to one-way traffic with flaggers throughout the north end of the project corridor.
- » Roadway reconstruction and paving will be ongoing in the travel lanes heading away from the park between the Park Gate and downtown Springdale.
